Growing Projects Raise Funds for Overseas Ag Training Programs

Through Growing Projects, U.S. farmers come together with their churches and surrounding communities to raise funds by selling a crop. Each Growing Project chooses the Overseas Program they wish to fund.

Farmers, landowners, schools, churches, civic groups, FFA chapters and corporations donate the use of land. Farmers donate equipment, time and transportation of the harvest to a local elevator. Ag suppliers donate or provide discount prices for seeds, fertilizers and inputs. Churches or supporting groups raise funds for inputs that aren't donated and out-of-pocket costs. The elevator sells the donated crop. By coming together the community accomplishes much more than on their own.

Overseas Programs provide ag training and tools for subsistence farmers in developing countries, so they can grow enough food to eat year-round, sell the extra, break the cycle of hunger and poverty, and afford basic medical care for their families and school for their children.
