Many programs provide training and tools while implementation is carried out using local labor and resources. This approach leads to local ownership and sustainable development.

Animal Husbandry



Chicken or Duck

\$11

Chickens and ducks are an ideal source of protein. Both meat and eggs help improve a family's dietary diversity.



Beehive

\$44

Apiculture is a great addition to other farming systems as the bees provide pollination services. Beekeepers can earn a good income by selling honey.



Small Animal Starter Pack

\$110

Small animals like rabbits and guinea pigs are a good protein option where refrigeration is not available since the meat can be consumed by a family in a single day. They also reproduce quickly, providing a regular source of meat and income.



Sheep or Goat

\$165

Sheep and Goats provide the 4 M's: Meat, Milk, Money and Manure. The first three contribute to a diversified diet and manure is a useful fertilizer for crops, reducing input costs.



Pig

\$220

Pigs are often a good money maker for families in need of cash to cover school fees or other household costs. Many farmers raise pigs to sell for holidays or special occasions when pork is in demand and the price is at its highest.



Cow or Camel

\$385

Large animals like cattle or camels provide milk, and they can also be useful for transportation or field work.



Fish Farming Starter Kit

\$825

Aquaculture works well as part of an integrated farming system or in areas where land is scarce and ponds are readily available. Fish protein is great for family use or as a source of income.



Veterinary Training Course

In some areas, veterinarians are few and far between, but by training village veterinary technicians to give vaccines, and identify and treat common diseases, animal health is greatly improved.

Community Savings & Loans



Savings Group Starter Kit

\$275

When a new Community Savings and Loans group is started, participants receive training from program staff on how to keep records and establish their group rules and procedures. In some cases, literacy and numeracy training may also be required. They also need a cash lock box and cash book to keep records. The long-term impact of these groups on the community is incredible as they are able to reinvest their funds locally rather than paying high-interest loans to outside moneylenders.

Creation Care



Tree Seedling

Some agricultural development programs establish local tree nurseries to encourage participants to plant trees in deforested areas, or use them as part of a terracing system to prevent soil erosion.



Seeds

Giving farmers access to quality seeds is an important way to improve yields. Some agricultural development programs include training on seed saving or community seed exchanges. Others prioritize seed storage.



Ecostove

Using ecostoves for cooking reduces the amount of firewood needed and helps to prevent deforestation. Some agricultural development programs promote biodigesters as an environmentally friendly fuel source.



Eco-Friendly Agriculture Training

Sustainable agriculture begins with training on methods that are appropriate for the local context. Training often involves demonstration, since seeing is believing. Topics might include composting, producing natural pesticides, Conservation Agriculture, the System of Rice Intensification (SRI), Sloping Agricultural Land Technology (SALT) and others.

Empowering Women



Maternal & Child Health Training

The first 1,000 days of life, from conception to age 2, is a critical time for development. Help a mother learn about good nutrition and health practices so she and her children can flourish. Some communities also offer child growth monitoring to ensure that children are growing appropriately.

Latrine

Access to toilets prevents diseases that spread through open defacation. When people aren't sick, they can process the calories they consume and have energy to work and provide for their families.
